

# Message from Lisa Schilling—Huntcliff Executive Director

We will be conducting these inspections on October 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> and October 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup>. The inspection should take 10-15 minutes per apartment A Huntcliff Team Member will be accompanying the inspector. More detailed information will be coming prior to your inspection date.


